Peer Learning

Definition

- Acquisition of knowledge and skill through active helping and support among peers
- Recripocal and mutually beneficial
- Occurs among peers from similar social groupings, who are not professional teachers
- Peers are equals in standing or matched companions

Mhh

- Brings the learner into a deeper thinking
- Learner will see various ways to solve a problem
- Feedback from teammates
- Places the learner in a confident state of mind

Influence of the Pandemic

Changes

- Much more regular meetings with people from other organizations
 - Meetings need less time
 - No need for extra rooms (other than the virtual one)
 - No extra costs for travels etc.
- Exchange with people from other institutions facilitated
- Main benefits
 - Development of technology
 - Customization to the needs of user
 - Increase of usability and accessibility
 - Availability for customers
 - Development of mindset to organise peer learning with other organisations, countries etc.





Our learnings

- Availability of technology and culture for online communication
 - Technologies were already there, but they are more visible than before
 - Optimized to the needs of users
 - Mindset shift out of necessity to keep things going
